DID YOU KNOW?...

Museum Residences is Daniel Libeskind's first completed condominium project in the world and Libeskind's first completed residential project in the United States.

From the terrace of Museum Residences you can view projects by world-renowned architects Gio Ponti (original Denver Art Museum), Daniel Libeskind (new expansion of Denver Art Museum) and Michael Graves (Denver Public Library).

The Fredrick C. Hamilton Building and the Museum Residences are connected by Martin Plaza, a 75,000 square foot pedestrian area. Designed by Daniel Libeskind, Martin Plaza creates a pedestrian connection between the Golden Triangle area and Civic Center Park. The Plaza features the artwork Big Sweep by Coosje van Bruggen and Claes Oldenburg, and a piece by Beverly Pepper called Denver Monoliths.

Museum Residences wraps around three of the four sides of the Cultural Center Parking garage. Three distinct owners and financing structures co-exist to support this unique public/private parking garage.

The Mizel Museum is set to move into the ground floor of Museum Residences by the end of 2007.
